Walda Katz-Fishman is a scholar activist and popular educator who combines her research and teaching interests in class, race/ethnicity/nationality, and gender inequality and political economy with political activism in bottom-up struggles for economic equality and race and gender justice. She is a professor of sociology at Howard University, where she has taught since 1970, Board Chair of Project South: Institute for the Elimination of Poverty & Genocide, a Steering Committee member of Grassroots Global Justice and a Coordinating Committee member of the U.S. Social Forum, among others.
